1. General relationships and sex education

5. Contraception and safe sex

7. Pregnancy

8. Parenting

 Cost: £45.00 or £125.00 for the full pregnancy and parenting collection.
- <u>Change: You and Your Little Child 1-5 Easy Read book</u> covering nutrition and healthy eating, hygiene, setting routines (potty training, bathing and bedtime), learning through play, going to nursery, and how to develop positive parenting skills and support good behaviour in young children. For: People with a learning disability. Cost: £45.00 or £125.00 for the full pregnancy and parenting collection.



9. Recognising abuse and how to get

help

Recommended recognising abuse and how to get help resources are:

- <u>Books Beyond Words: Accessible books</u> about surviving abuse. For: People with a learning disability. Cost: £10.00 per book or £72.00 for the full set.
- <u>Change: Understanding Sexual Abuse Easy Read booklet</u> covering how to recognise and report abuse, saying 'no', rape, pornography, the law, disclosure, and where to get help. For: People with a learning disability. Cost: £6.99.

10. Organisations that offer advice and

guidance

Recommended organisations where you can get advice and guidance are:

- Brook services across the UK providing free and confidential sexual health services to young people under 25.
- <u>Family Planning Association</u> relationships and sex education resources for people with a learning disability. They also offer training courses for professionals working with people with a learning disability.
- <u>NSPCC</u> guidance on safeguarding children and preventing abuse. They have relationships and sex education resources for children and young people with a learning disability.
- <u>Respond</u> work with children and adults with a learning disability who have experienced abuse or trauma, as well as those who have abused others, through psychotherapy, advocacy, campaigning and other support.
- <u>Stonewall</u> campaigns for the equality of lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans people across Britain. They offer help and support, and can signpost to local LGBT services and community groups.
- <u>Supported Loving</u> campaign set up by Choice Support to highlight the importance of good support in helping people with a learning disability find love.
- <u>Terrence Higgins Trust</u> provides HIV and sexual health services in the UK, and runs community projects for people living with HIV.
- <u>The Sex Education Forum</u> works to achieve quality relationships and sex education for all children and young people in England. They provide resources and training to teachers and professionals, to support the delivery of relationships and sex education.





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
